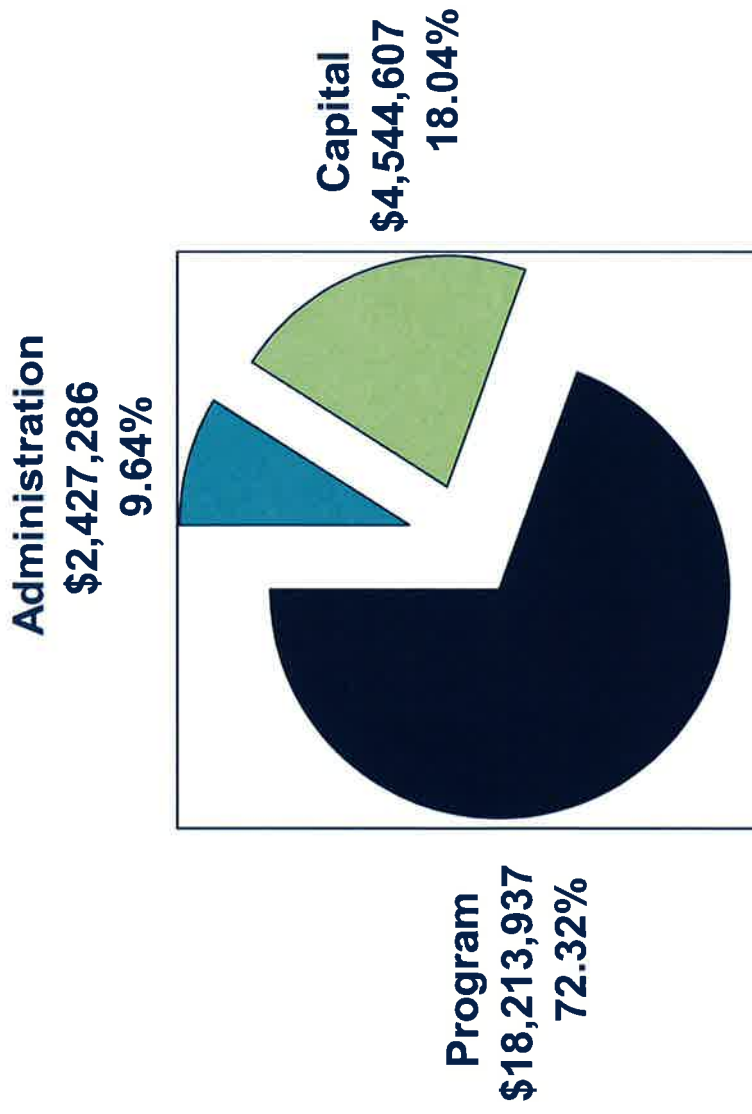

PROPOSITION #1

Resolved, that the Board of Education of the South Lewis Central School District, Lewis County, New York be authorized to levy the necessary tax for and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$25,185,830.00 for the purpose of the General Fund Budget for the 2017-18 school year.

PROPOSITION #2

Resolved, that the Board of Education of the South Lewis Central School District, Lewis County, New York is hereby authorized to purchase two 66-passenger buses and one 53-passenger bus for a total maximum aggregate cost of \$311,340.00 and that sum of \$311,340.00, or as much thereof as may be necessary shall be raised by the levy of the tax upon the taxable property of said school district and collected in annual installments as provided by Section 416 of the Education Law and in anticipation of such tax, obligations of said school district shall be issued.

PROPOSITION #3

Resolved, that the Board of Education of the South Lewis Central School District, Lewis County, New York be authorized to levy a tax in the amount of \$80,000 as an annual appropriation to be divided in equal shares and paid to the Port Leyden Community Library, Constableville Village Library, Lyons Falls Free Library and B. Elizabeth Strong Memorial Library for the support and operation of the libraries.

The South Lewis Superintendent Evaluation is designed to help the Board of Education and Superintendent of Schools boards and develop thoughtful, constructive evaluations that advance district goals and keep the leadership team healthy.

An effective evaluation requires commitments from both the Board of Education and Superintendent of Schools as outlined below:

Board Member Commitments

- Participate in the agreed upon process and evaluation discussions with honesty and integrity.
- Each board member should rate all performance indicators and goals based on evidence.
- Identify the Superintendent's strengths and areas for improvement

Superintendent Commitments

- Understand, agree to and participate in the articulated process and evaluation discussions.
- Gather and provide information and evidence if requested by the Board.

The format of evaluation will be a rubric style evaluation to determine levels of performance for the Superintendent. Each section contains particular indicators with specific criteria to rate the performance level. The five evaluation areas, listed below, are to be scored on a HEDI scale of Highly Effective, Effective, Developing, and Ineffective. Should any indicator and/or section be rated Developing or Ineffective it must be supported by evidence and commented upon.

- Relationship with the Board
- Community Relations
- Staff Relations
- Business and Finance
- Instructional Leadership

In addition to these five basic areas the Superintendent will also set goals.

- Superintendent conducts a self-assessment
- Superintendent and Board hold a meeting to review goals, self-assessment, and overall evaluation progress/status

**SPECIAL EDUCATION: NON-RESIDENT STUDENT TUITION
AGREEMENT**

AGREEMENT made by and between the Board of Education of the South Lewis Central School District, having its principal office at 4264 East Road, Post Office Box 10 Turin, New York 13473 (hereinafter called the "Receiving School District") and the Board of Education of the Lowville Academy and Central Schools, having its principal office at 7688 State Street, Lowville, New York 13367 (hereinafter called the "Sending School District").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Sending School District is authorized under the Education Law to contract with other public school districts within the State of New York for the instruction of students with disabilities and has determined that the Receiving School District's Program at the South Lewis Central School District ("Program") is appropriate for the student; and

WHEREAS, the Receiving School District is a public school district within the State of New York authorized to provide special education and related services to students with disabilities;

WHEREAS, the Receiving School District current has a placement available in its 12:1+1 special education program located at South Lewis Middle-High School in Turin, New York.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties mutually agree as follows:

A. TERM:

1. The Sending School District hereby agrees to place, and the Receiving School District agrees to accept, the student(s) listed on the attached "Confidential Schedule A" in an appropriate 12:1+1 program of the Receiving School District for the 2016-17 school year. The term of this Agreement shall be from September 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017, inclusive, unless earlier terminated as provided in this Agreement.

B. COMPENSATION:

1. The Sending School District agrees to pay nonresident tuition in the amount of \$ 22,392.00 per student for the 2016-17 school year in four equal installments on September 1, 2016, December 1, 2016, March 1, 2017 and June 1, 2017.
2. Receiving School District shall submit a written invoice to the Sending School District which references the time period for which payment is being

requested and includes a breakdown of the total amount due for the period specified.

3. The Sending School District shall pay the Receiving School District in accordance with the schedule set forth above.

C. SERVICES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

1. The Receiving School District shall provide the services in its 12:1+1 program by an appropriately certified classroom teacher and teaching assistant or teacher aide as set forth in each student's Individualized Education Program (IEP). Speech therapy, occupational therapy, physical therapy 1 to 1 teacher aide and other support services are not provided through this agreement, but are available to be provided through a separate agreement with the Jefferson-Lewis-Hamilton-Herkimer-Oneida (JLHH) BOCES. The Sending School District shall obtain and provide to the Receiving School District such releases, prescriptions and/or other legal documents as necessary for the Receiving School District to provide such services and to fulfill its obligations under this Agreement. The Sending School District shall provide prompt written notice to the Receiving School District of any modification of a student's IEP.
2. In the event that additional placements of students in the 12:1+1 program are sought the Sending School District shall submit a written request to the Receiving School District that a student(s) is to be added or deleted from the Confidential Schedule A. Such notice shall be given thirty days in advance or as soon as the Sending School District becomes aware of the student terminating attendance in the Receiving School District's program. The Receiving School District shall notify the Sending School District in writing within 15 days if it has space and program available in its 12:1+1 program and is willing to accept an additional placement. In the event that a student(s) is/are added or deleted during the term of this Agreement, the payment amount owed by the Sending School District shall be adjusted accordingly.
3. The Receiving School District shall perform all services under this Agreement in accordance with all applicable Federal, State and local laws, rules, regulations and policies as well as established policy guidance from the New York State Education Department.
4. The Receiving School District agrees to report to the Sending School District on the progress of the student as requested and as set forth in the student's IEP. The Receiving School District agrees to permit a representative or representatives of the Committee on Special Education of the Sending School District to visit the program in which the student is enrolled upon reasonable prior written notice.

5. The Receiving School District shall make qualified personnel available to participate in meetings of the Sending School District's Committee on Special Education (CSE), where appropriate, upon reasonable prior notice to the Receiving School District of such meetings.
6. The Receiving School District shall comply with the provisions of the Safe Schools Against Violence in Education (SAVE) Act including background checks and fingerprinting of all staff directly providing services to students.
7. In the event that the parent or person in parental relation to a student(s) receiving services pursuant to this Agreement files a request for an impartial hearing or administrative complaint or initiates litigation in connection with such services, the Receiving School District shall promptly give written notice of same to the Sending School District. The Sending School District shall be responsible for defending any impartial due process hearing.
8. Both parties to this Agreement understand that they may receive and/or come into contact with protected health information as defined by the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (HIPAA). The parties hereby acknowledge their respective responsibilities pursuant to HIPAA and shall comply with said Regulations, if applicable.
9. Both parties acknowledge and agree to comply with all laws, rules and/or regulations as applicable and pertaining to the confidentiality of information obtained, transmitted, reviewed, generated, requested, provided, maintained and/or otherwise utilized in connection with this Agreement. This shall include but not be limited to the requirements of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act ("IDEA"), the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act ("FERPA") and any concurrent Federal and/or State law, rule and/or regulation. The Receiving School agrees that it will not disclose confidential information to third parties except as provided for and necessitated under this Agreement. This provision will survive the termination of this agreement.

D. REPRESENTATIONS:

2. The Receiving School District represents that services under this Agreement shall be provided by qualified individuals of good character and in good professional standing. The Receiving School District represents that no individuals providing services under this Agreement are currently charged, nor in the past have been charged with any relevant criminal or professional misconduct or incompetence.

3. In the event that the required license/certification of any agent or employee of the Receiving School District providing services under this Agreement is revoked, terminated, suspended, or otherwise impaired, the Receiving School District shall immediately notify the Sending School District in accordance with the requirements for all notices pursuant to this Agreement set forth below.
4. Nothing contained herein, shall serve to transfer responsibilities for the student from the Sending School District to the Receiving School District of offering a free appropriate public education except for the provision of the particular special education services contracted herein.

E. CONDITIONS:

1. This Agreement, and any amendments to this Agreement, will not be in effect until agreed to in writing and signed by authorized representatives of both parties.
2. Receiving School District agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the Sending School District, its officers, directors, agents, or employees against all claims, demands, actions, lawsuits, costs, damages and expenses, including attorney fees, judgments, fines and amounts arising from any willful act, omission, error, recklessness or negligence of the Receiving School District, its officers, directors, agents or employees in connection with the performance of services pursuant to this Agreement. This indemnity shall survive the termination of this Agreement.
3. Sending School District agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the Receiving School District, its officers, directors, agents, or employees against all claims, demands, actions, lawsuits, costs, damages and expenses, including attorney fees, judgments, fines and amounts arising from any willful act, omission, error, recklessness or negligence of the Sending School District, its officers, directors, agents or employees in connection with the performance of services pursuant to this Agreement. This indemnity shall survive the termination of this Agreement.

F. TERMINATION:

1. Either the Sending School District or the Receiving School District may terminate this Agreement upon thirty (30) days prior written notice to the other party, subject to any asserted pendency rights. Such notice shall be given in accordance with the requirements for all notices pursuant to this Agreement set forth below.
2. The parties agree that either party's failure to comply with any terms or

conditions of this Agreement will provide a basis for the other party to immediately terminate this Agreement without any further liability to the party, which violated the Agreement.

3. In the event the Sending School District or the Receiving School District terminates this Agreement with or without cause, such termination of the Agreement shall not discharge the parties' existing obligations to each other as of the effective date of termination.
4. In the event the Sending School District's CSE changes the student's enrollment, program or placement recommendation, the Receiving School District shall be entitled to a pro rata share of tuition through and including the final date of the student's attendance in the Program or the last day noticed, whichever is later.
5. In the event that the Receiving School District no longer has a suitable program or placement available for the student or in the event that the student is removed from the programs for failure to attend school, for failure to adhere to the receiving District's Code of Conduct or for disciplinary reasons, the Receiving School District shall notify the Sending School District and tuition shall be adjusted on a pro rata basis through and including the final date of the student's attendance or the last day noticed, whichever is later.

1. It is expressly understood that this Agreement shall not be assigned or transferred without prior written consent of the other party.

2. The failure of either party to enforce any provision of this Agreement shall not be construed as a waiver or limitation of that party's right to subsequently enforce every provision of this Agreement.
3. Should any provision of this Agreement, for any reason, be declared invalid and/or unenforceable, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining provisions of this Agreement. Such remaining provisions shall remain in full force and effect as if this Agreement had been executed with the invalid provisions(s) eliminated.
4. This Agreement and the rights and obligations of the parties hereunder shall be construed in accordance with, and governed by, the laws and regulations of the State of New York and applicable Federal laws and regulations.
5. Any unresolved dispute arising under this Agreement shall be litigated in Supreme Court, Lewis County, New York.
6. This Agreement, along with the attached "Schedule A," is the complete and exclusive statement of the Agreement between the parties, and supersedes all prior or contemporaneous, oral or written: proposals, understandings, representations, conditions or covenants between the parties relating to the subject matter of the Agreement.
7. This Agreement may not be changed orally, but only by an agreement, in writing, signed by authorized representatives of both parties.
8. This Agreement, and any amendments to this Agreement, will not be in effect until agreed to in writing and signed by authorized representatives of both parties.
