Medieval Europe, Crusades, Dark Ages

- Lord-in feudal Europe, a person who controlled the land and could therefore grant estates to vassals
- <u>Vassal</u>-in feudal Europe, a person who received a grant of land from a lord in exchange for a pledge of loyalty and services
- Knight-in medieval Europe, an armored warrior who fought on horseback
- Serf-a medieval peasant legally bound to live on a lord's estate
- Manor-a lord's estate in feudal Europe
- <u>Bubonic Plague</u>-a deadly disease that spread across Asia and Europe in the mid-14th century, killing millions of people
- <u>Crusades</u>- (1000s-1300s) series of holy wars between the Christians and Muslims to regain the holy land (Palestine: Jerusalem)
- Fief-an estate granted to a vassal by a lord under the feudal system in medieval Europe
- Chivalry-a code of behavior for knights in medieval Europe, stressing ideals such as courage & loyalty

Medieval Asia

<u>Feudalism</u>-a political system in which nobles are granted the use of lands that belong to their king, in exchange for their loyalty, military service, and protection of the people who live on the land
<u>Samurai</u>-one of the professional warriors who served Japanese feudal lords
<u>Shogun</u>-in feudal Japan, a supreme military commander who ruled in the name of the emperor
<u>Daimyo</u>-a Japanese feudal lord who commanded a private army of samurai
<u>Bushido</u>-the strict code of behavior followed by samurai warriors in Japan
<u>Calligraphy</u>-the art of beautiful handwriting
